A **prime number** is a positive integer with only two factors: itself and one.
A **composite number** is a positive integer with more than two factors.

Divisibility Rules

Divisible: able to be divided evenly with no remainder.

Divisor: the number that divides another number.

Dividend: the number being divided.

Quotient: the result of a division.

Remainder: the amount left over after division.

Factor: a number that divides another number evenly.

Multiple: the product of a number and an integer.

Prime factor: a prime number that divides another number evenly.

Least common multiple (LCM): the smallest number that is a multiple of two or more numbers.

Least common denominator (LCD): the smallest number that is a multiple of two or more denominators.

Common factor: a factor that two or more numbers have in common.

Common multiple: a multiple that two or more numbers have in common.

Common denominator: a denominator that two or more fractions have in common.

Common divisor: a divisor that two or more numbers have in common.

Common multiple: a multiple that two or more numbers have in common.

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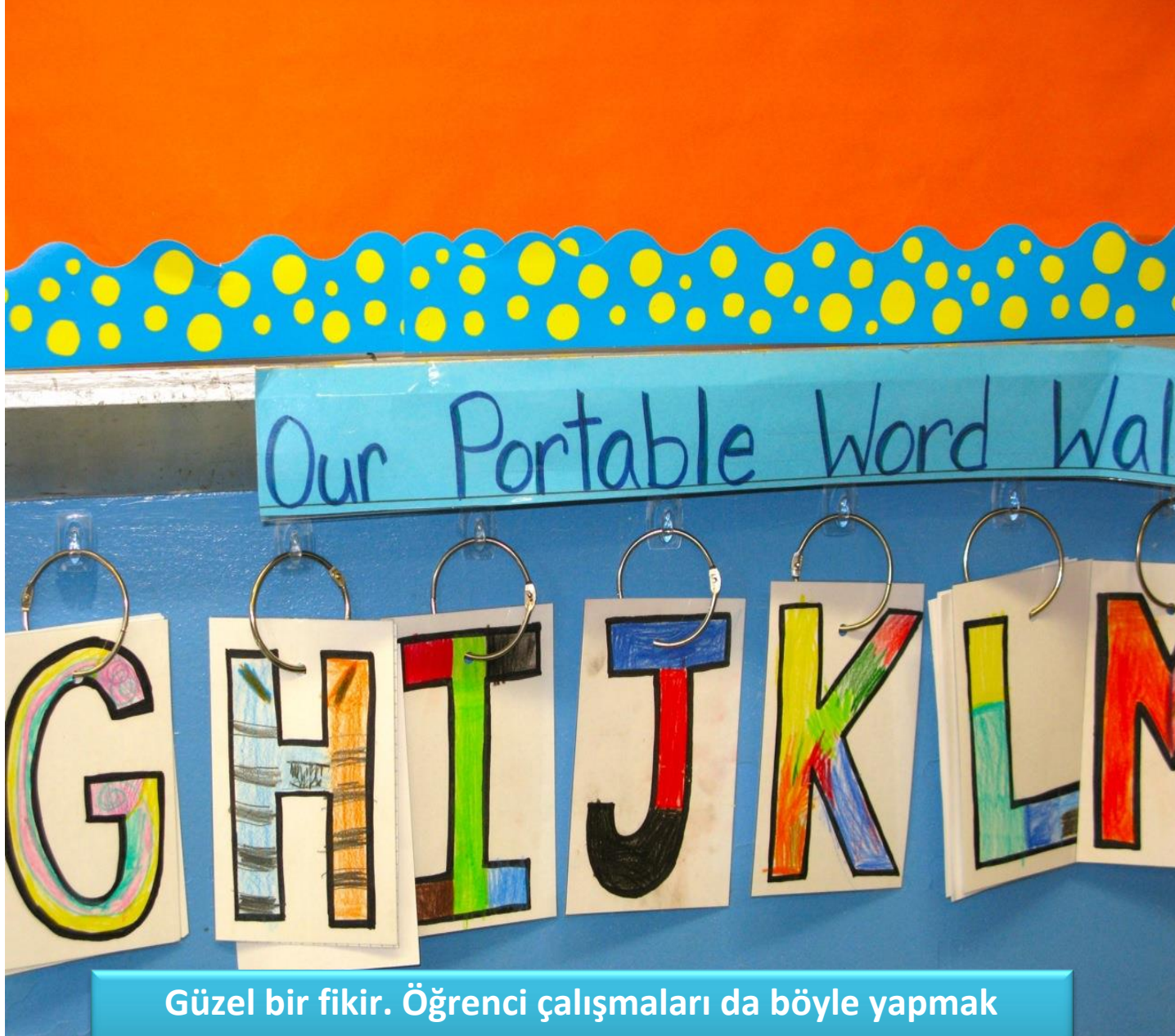
